CARRIAGE LIGHT/LAMP POST BULBS

As you all know we want the neighborhood to be inviting and safe. To that end we have asked that all units keep their outdoor lampposts on after dark. With the electric eye in the lamppost they go on and off automatically as long as the power is kept on.

Right now we have a variety of light bulbs throughout the neighborhood. So for consistency, low maintenance and reduced energy cost we'd like to recommend a LED lightbulb for use across all units.

It is a Sylvania Ultra Filament **Soft White** LED. The bulb is clear, 60W but uses 13 watts, so it is bright, energy efficient and should require little atten-

tion. It casts a nice light glow that is very attractive. If you would like to see one check out the lamppost in the parking by the pool fence. They are available at Lowes and you may find them elsewhere.

These bulbs are much better than traditional, or CFL or halogen bulbs. We're suggesting you switch to this bulb next time you need a replacement or earlier.
