## SPOTLIGHT ON THE RESIDENTS

### Lora Wilson

I was raised in Monroeville and graduated from Gateway High School. I studied business and journalism at Duquesne University. I met my late-husband Robb in 1979. He acted as a time-warper at the Rocky Horror Picture Show with a friend of mine who introduced us. We eloped in 1981 and both went on to work for the University of Pittsburgh and to earn masters degrees there.

We enjoyed traveling to interesting destinations including Brazil, Iceland and many places in USA, Europe and the UK. Robb was fortunate to have received a kidney/pancreas transplant from a deceased donor in 1999. After meeting other transplant recipients and realizing the great need for kidneys, I donated my right kidney in 2005. Robb and I both competed in the US Transplant Games many times. We were privileged to go to the World Transplant Games in Sweden in 2011. Robb started a non-profit, the Western Pa Kidney Support Groups to help individuals and caregivers to live well with kidney disease. We were both long-time volunteers for the American Dia-

betes Association and helped them to start their walk event in Pittsburgh. Our walk team raised over \$100,000 for the cause.

Prior to moving to the Isles in 2013, we lived in Churchill where I tended a very larger perennial garden and he planted lots of trees. We were attracted to single level, low-maintenance living because his health was declining due to Parkinson's disease.

In 2018, I retired from my position as a Regional Practice Manager at Pittsburgh Bone, Joint & Spine

where I worked for 20 years. I worked in healthcare as a manager and medical coder for more than 33 years, mostly in orthopaedics. I was fortunate to be able to care for Robb at home until illness took him to his heavenly home in October 2018. Shortly after Robb's death, my dad suffered a stroke. Dad lived here with me after completing rehab.

I started running at age 50 and I am an active member of the Steel City Road Runners. I did my first destination half-marathon in Atlanta in December and ran the 2020 Pittsburgh Virtual Half-Marathon as a fundraiser for Parkinson's disease. This summer, I am walking and running 300 miles, a virtual event between Pittsburgh and Philadelphia.

Before COVID, I worked as a substitute organist at Christ the Divine Shepherd Parish in Monroeville and Penn Hills.

In an effort to simplify my life and my home, I have an eBay store where I am selling many of the items that Robb and I collected over the years. I think he would be pleased that his treasures are going all over the world.

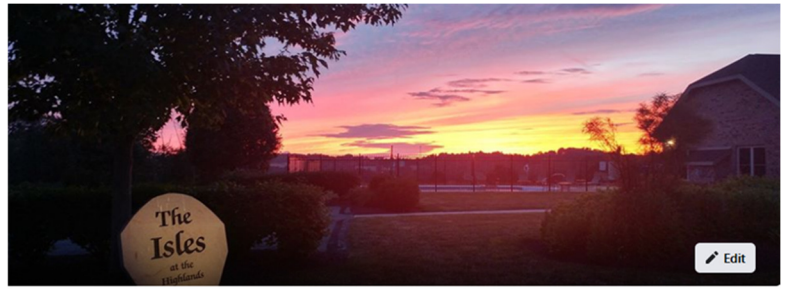
